About us

International Mother Language Movement (IMLM) is an inclusive community based platform in Canberra dedicated in highlighting the importance of preserving all the languages especially endangered languages in a multilingual and multicultural context. We are committed to sensitizing the various Australian Governments, various communities about the necessities of taking appropriate measures to protect and preserve all the spoken languages including indigenous languages as a means to strengthen the multicultural bond.

Language is immutably linked with culture and cultural identity. Therefore the demise of a language is a loss of identity for the community involved.

UNESCO proclaimed 21 February as International Mother Language Day in recognition of the supreme sacrifice of the Bangla (Bengali) speaking people of Bangladesh. It urged member states to observe the day in a befitting manner to promote awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity.

Vision Statement

We will promote linguistic diversity; develop a multilingual society; and preserve cultural pluralism and greater understanding, trust, tolerance and mutual respect across all communities.

Mission Statement

Objectives:

- Work as a platform for connecting ethnic and indigenous communities to work in unison to celebrate IMLD.
- Erect Australian Mother Language Monument (AMLM) in a place of national significance in Canberra, Australia.

Activities

IMLM organises annual 'Language Walk' in Canberra to commemorate IMLD to raise awareness among the diverse ethnic communities of Canberra region. Last two 'Language Walk' s (21 February 2014, 2015 and 2016) attracted people of different ethnic and linguistic communities. It received good media coverage including ABC Television.
